Cybersecurity Update: Olympics and More Smart Vigilance - Cyber Threats Continue

- ChatGPT has created malware that disguises itself as a screensaver app that then
 auto-launches itself onto Window's devises. Fox News reports that this app will
 scrub through all kinds of files including Word documents, images, and PDFs, and
 search for any valuable data it can steal
- Al-driven risk intelligence will combat disinformation as hackers work to disrupt your Olympics experience. <u>Google Cloud reports</u> that threats will target government officials, athletes, tourists, Paris infrastructure, and payment and ticketing systems.
